The Department of Psychology in Dedman College invites applications for a Director of the SMU Psychology Clinic, who will be hired as clinical assistant (or associate) professor to begin as early as December 1, 2022. The SMU Psychology Clinic is a non-profit training clinic housed within SMU's Department of Psychology. The doctoral program in the Department of Psychology is an APA-accredited clinical science program and is a member of the Academy of Psychological Clinical Science. The Psychology Clinic facilitates the integration of research and practice in clinical training within a clinical science model. Qualifications and Responsibilities: The successful candidate will have a Ph.D. from a PCSAS- or APA-accredited clinical psychology program and be a licensed psychologist (or license eligible) in Texas. In addition, applicants must have experience in psychological services and supervision and a demonstrated commitment to the clinical science training model. The candidate must also demonstrate a commitment to providing access of services to underserved and diverse populations, as well as a commitment to lead the Psychology Clinic's focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion with our trainees.

The clinic director will be responsible for the operations of the clinic, including: practicum instruction and supervision of clinical science PhD students, clinic administration, coordination of student clinical practicum internal and external to the clinic, recruitment and oversight of clinical supervisors for the clinic, and adherence to ethical and legal standards of professional conduct and APA accreditation standards. Clinic services and supervision will include both assessment and intervention. In addition to these primary responsibilities, the clinic director will work with department faculty on other activities related to the doctoral program and may teach graduate-level courses (or an occasional undergraduate course).

Candidates should submit a statement that describes experience with clinic administration, clinical training and expertise, and approach to clinical supervision; a CV; and a 1-page statement describing how the applicant will lead the Psychology Clinic's focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion. To ensure full consideration, the application must be received by November 1, 2022 but the committee will continue to accept applications until the position is filled.
